Childlike Faith

Mark 10:14-16 - But when Jesus saw it, He was greatly displeased and said to them, "Let the little children come to Me, and do not forbid them; for of such is the kingdom of God. Assuredly, I say to you, whoever does not receive the kingdom of God as a little child will by no means enter it." And He took them up in His arms, laid His hands upon them, and blessed them.

What do you think of when it's storming and the power goes out? Do you worry about all the groceries you'll lose or whether your sump pump will fail and your basement will flood? If it's winter, are you worried about the pipes freezing? Are you worried if you will have food in the morning, or are you remembering the last time this happened and hoping that there will be pudding for breakfast again? Are you stumbling around looking for batteries and back-up phone chargers, or are you excited to break out the candles and play cards with your family in the dark? In short, are you approaching your problems like an adult who is thinking about the practicalities of solving everything yourself, or are you looking at life with the wonder of a child, for whom anything can be an adventure, and embracing what is, to our finite view, unexpected? For most children, budgeting is not yet a familiar concept, so why would it be a problem to throw away the food if it spoils when the fridge shuts off? There's more at the store, after all. Similarly, when we encounter difficulties or our path is not easily visible, we sometimes focus too much on how this is a problem because of our understanding of the situation and how it does not fit into our plans. But, in reality, we should be like the child who has no doubt that his needs will not be met, because our Father has everything under control. We may need to use resources creatively, and things may turn out in unexpected ways for a while, but it will be alright. The power will come back on, and the path will become clear once again.

Records Updates

We've reached that time of year when we will be inventorying records for returning students in addition to collecting information from incoming students. You may receive requests for updated immunizations this month. Please, do not be alarmed, as this does not mean that your child is behind on their shots, only that we need new records showing they are still up to date. Some of the big milestones for this are when students go into Kindergarten, 8th grade, and 12th Grade. Students usually complete their series for DTaP, MMR, and Varicella when they turn 4 years old, but it can be easy to forget to send us their new records before kindergarten if you already gave us documents when they enrolled in preschool. Students going into 8th grade will need an MCV and their Tdap booster. Seniors who received their first MCV shot before turning 16 must have a second MCV shot before entering 12th grade.

We do accept religious and medical exemptions. We will just need to have a copy of the completed form on file. For mor information on immunization requirements, please, go to:
